We are strengthening our partnerships with key programs, such as STAND and PUSH, to ensure that these programs continue to have a positive impact on youth in our community.

We are planning a third annual resource day and expungement clinic to support employment and job readiness for local families.

We will amplify our voices in advocacy and policy conversations that impact the people we serve.

We will be enhancing our outreach with more robust marketing and web presence.



What an incredible year for Columbia Community Care. We solidified our strategic growth plan, which includes establishing a community center in the heart of Columbia centered on restorative justice through education, services, and resources.

our **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

We also honed our focus on high impact programs for youth, partnering with S.T.A.N.D HoCo and P.U.S.H to send our first group of young people to Mexico for the Black August Summer Institute. And, we continue to operate our food distribution sites and grocery delivery service, which is the cornerstone of our mission to connect people, resources, and opportunities.

TRANSFORMATIVE EXPERIENCES for young people

In August, we were able to send several of our youth mentee to the Black August Summer Institute in Mexico, hosted at the idyllic Mud & Lotus Baja.The mentees and mentors alike immersed themselves in new experiences—from horseback riding and interacting with farm animals to participating in rigorous physical activities and engaging cultural exchanges. Throughout the experience, they gained invaluable knowledge about Revolutionary Black history, sustainable agriculture, and vital life skills such as CPR and self-defense. They practiced yoga, mindfulness, and discussed the realities of immigration and border relations – opening their eyes to a world beyond their immediate environments.

Watching the mentees develop self-pride and self-love as they conquered each new challenge with the support of their peers was profoundly moving. This experience was the first of what we hope will be many more, all aimed at providing transformative opportunities for growth and development.

roots for **A NEW HOME**

In April, Columbia Community Care announced a partnership with Columbia Concepts to redevelop the Columbia Flier building into a multi-use community center. To be known as The Source, the center will provide safe and inclusive spaces with access to an abundance of resources, programs and services such as physical and mental healthcare, a food hall, a gymnasium, game rooms, a recording studio, computer access and Wi-Fi service, tutoring, arts engagement, mentorship programs and employment resources.

The new center, which will be constructed and operated by Columbia Concepts, will create at least 100 new jobs.

Our vision is to create a hub where the community can connect, engage, and make a difference.


